## *Summer Recycling and Reuse Tips*

Summer is a great time to enjoy the family, friends and the great outdoors. So as you begin planning for some needed fun in the summer, remember to follow these recycling and reuse tips to have a GREEN-tastic summer.

### Reduce & Reuse:

- Rather than buying a ton of small, travel sized toiletries, purchase a set of small reusable containers, and fill them up as needed.
- Choose to use electronic tickets when booking airline tickets.
- Pack road trip snacks in reusable containers.
- Choose washable, reusable napkins, tablecloths, plates and utensils for your picnics and cookouts.
- Skip individually packaged drinks and opt for coolers filled with your favorite beverage.

### Recycle:

- If you must use the travel sized toiletries, be sure to recycle them afterwards.
- If you are having a party at a location that doesn't offer recycling, bring your own container. Collect the recyclables and place them out with your curbside collection or bring them to one of our Citizen Drop-Off locations.
- Preparing for a road trip? Make sure you recycle your motor oil.



## Please don't use plastic bags!

You can use anything as a container for your recyclables **except** plastic bags. Many grocery stores and supermarkets will recycle plastic bags.



## Acceptable and Unacceptable Recycling Materials

### Acceptable Recycling Material:

- Aerosol Cans (empty)
- Aluminum: cans, beverage and food containers, foil (clean), and pie pans
- Bottles: narrow-neck bottles
- Cartons (waxed): used for a liquid such as juices, milk or soups
- Glass containers such as bottles and jars (brown, clear or green)
- Metal: beverage and food containers
- Plastic: bottles and jars
- Prescription bottles, including caps
- Steel: beverage containers and food
- Tin: cans and foil

### Rigid Plastics

#### (to be taken to the citizen drop-off centers)

Rigid plastics include milk/soda crates, buckets, laundry baskets, children's toys, etc.

### Unacceptable Recycling Material Examples:

- Cookware and plates (plastic)
- Containers of toxic substances -e.g., cans motor oil, pesticides, etc.
- Contaminated paper products -e.g., napkins, paper towels, and tissue
- Dry cleaning bags
- Glass (window and mirror)
- Waxed paper

#### SW & NE Quadrants

- Odd Sides: 3<sup>rd</sup> Wednesdays
- Even Sides: 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesdays
