The Baltimore City Department of Public Works Project Details

SC 911 – Herring Run Sewershed Improvements

Project History

In 2002 the City of Baltimore (City) entered into a Consent Decree with the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and the Maryland Department of the Environment (MDE). A Consent Decree is an agreement made in court by the parties to settle a suit in equity.

The Consent Decree enables the City to address sewer system deficiencies in a proactive program over a 15-year period. More information on the Consent Decree can be found at: <http://publicworks.baltimorecity.gov/>

Project Purpose

- To bring the City into long-term compliance with the Clean Water Act (1972)
- To comply with the conditions of the City's Consent Decree with the U.S. EPA and MDE
- To repair a sewer system that is up to 100 years old
- To improve sewage flows and pipe capacity
- To reduce/eliminate sewer overflows
- To eliminate street closures due to sewer pipe collapses
- To improve water quality in streams
- To prevent sewer back-ups into private property

Project Activities


- Rehabilitate sewers using cured-in-place pipe (CIPP) lining (39,200 LF)
- Replace sanitary sewer by open cut (2,075 LF)
- Replace sanitary sewer by open cut (34 EA)
- Sanitary sewer house connection rehabilitation (2,975 EA)
- rehabilitate existing manholes (37 EA)
- Replacing manholes (120 VLF)
- Clean and CCTV (1,250 LF)
- Non-excavation point repair (49 EA)
