


# Economic Impact of Utility Operations at Baltimore City Water & Wastewater Utility

## in the Baltimore-Columbia-Towson Metropolitan Statistical Area

### ECONOMIC IMPACT = 7,640 JOBS AND \$12.6 BILLION OVER TEN YEARS

The City of Baltimore's Water & Wastewater Utility's operations and capital plan investments contribute significantly to the local economy, in terms of both output (\$) and employment (jobs). The utility's estimated economic contribution to the region totals \$12.6 billion over the next decade, supporting 7,640 jobs per year.



Baltimore City's Water & Wastewater Utility provides water services to 1.8 million people, and treats 194 million gallons of wastewater per day.
